

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
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
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Thank you for downloading this awesomely fun Interactive Notebook for Wonder, by RJ Palacio. **How I Use this Resource** I use this product with students during their reading and can be completed with a Literature Circle group or independently. I have done it both ways, it just depends on the class (behavior, ability, etc.) Students are asked to read a set of pages before meeting with their group. I assign the reading as homework. The next day, they meet with their group members and follow the directions for each section of reading. **Preparing for the Interactive Notebook** Students can either complete the Interactive Notebook in a 1-subject notebook or a binder. If students use a binder, the teacher will have to provide white blank paper with holes in it. One time, I even used plastic folders that have brads in the middle and I was able to have students add pages as they went along. It's completely up to you!



Students think about Auggie's Point of View and write in his diary, students identify character traits, make predictions and more!





Students use Context Clues to find meaning of unknown words, Make Inferences, Understand Idioms, Identify Character Conflict, Visualize, Make Connections and More!

Write about Via's point of view about the school play. Write Auggie's point of view. Then cut and paste to make a mini-flip book. Use the diagram above to help you.






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


Inference Box

Directions: Discuss with your group members about the fact that Via does not like to be identified as the girl with a brother who is deformed and how Miranda lied and pretended she had Via's life. Why do you think she did that? Do you think Miranda is a good friend to Via even after they "drifted away"?

Find evidence from the text that supports the idea that Miranda still acts as Via's friend. Cut out the shapes and paste the arrows onto the notebook page, pointing to the inference box. You may or may not use all of the arrows.




Directions: Discuss with your group members the makes Auggie nervous about the field trip. What has his experience been like so far? What do you predict will happen on the trip?


Pgs. 275 - 287 Gift for Auggie
